ACTION ITEMS

Minutes - The minutes of August 11, 2009 meetings were distributed. The minutes were approved by those in attendance.

REPORT ITEMS:

Back To School Night

Social Committee Funds

A check in the amount of \$112.86 was cut to Cindy Wofford for the Social Committee so these funds will no longer be tracked or housed in the Community Club account.

Walk-Jog-A-Thon October 2, 2009

This event is just around the corner and we will need volunteers. Also there was some discussion about bringing back the different prize levels and each student who raises money get to put a ticket in each can, up to the amount raised, which increases the numbers of winners. Rosemarie Craighead is spearheading this.

Harvest Festival October 23rd

There was a general discussion of the Harvest Festival. Helen Jackson attended the staff meeting on Monday August 31, 2009 and all grade level signed up for a game and a food. Next steps are to determine where the games and food booths will be, how funds will be handled at the Harvest festival and then what to do with the funds afterward. Helen Jackson suggested that Community Club be responsible for selling the tickets for games and foods that way you have only one booth handling money. Her suggestion was to have the game tickets cost less than the food tickets and each grade level set their prices for their booths. Mr. Lane then said he feels strongly that all monies earned should go back to the Community Club general fund. He said that with all Community Club does that where the funds should go, then if a teacher has a specific need they would come to Community Club and request money for their idea or need. There was some discussion as to the monies staying with the grade levels. The ultimate decision of where the money goes is an administrative decision so we left it at that.

Science Fundraiser

Mr. Lane asked that this item be placed on the agenda. Mr. Lane stated that he has started a recycling program of plastic bottles and cans in conjunction with his PGE grant from a couple of years ago. He has some Jr. high students who are going to help third grade teachers (who are the recipients of Mr. Lane's PG&E computers) facilitate this recycling program. The monies raised would be used for Science Projects. He is asking that the money raised be housed and tracked in the Community Club account. Helen Jackson asked how the items would get to the recycling center. Mr. Lane stated that the third grade staff would

coordinate that. Mrs. Jackson than said that you can set up a specific account at one of the recycling centers on Moffatt Blvd. and then parents could take their recyclables directly there and the funds can be placed into the Shasta Science account. Rose Craighead stated that when we take the plastic bottles to the recycling center to make sure that we have counted them out in groups of 100 so we get the full reimbursement of 5¢per bottle. So for instance for 100 24oz or less bottle we should receive \$5 however if the bottles are not counted out the center will just weigh the bottles and then you get approximately \$4.63 for the same number of bottles based on weight. Mr. Lane thought that his group of Jr. High students could count out the bottle.

Open Floor

Ms. Gomez wanted to thank Community Club and Rosemarie Craighead specifically for obtaining the tickets for the sixth grade to see the King Tut exhibit at the De Young Museum in San Francisco. Mrs. Wofford then added that this is a **sixth** grade only field trip taking place in February and they are looking forward to it.
