Habits of Success

Habits of Success, previously named Life Skills, best describe the skills students need to be successful in school, in person or during distance learning:

- Produces work at or above grade/ability
- Follows school rules, routines, and class expectations
- Prepared, organized, and on task
- Completes independent work on time
- Respects and collaborates well with others
- Digital Citizenship: Uses technology ethically and effectively
- Demonstrates grade appropriate technology skills

Class Marks or Effort Grades

The below marks reflect a student's effort and how well they meet grade level expectations:

- E** = Excellent or Exceeds Expectations
S = Satisfactory or Satisfactory Progress
N = Needs to Improve

Standards Performance Level

These marks indicate a student's progress toward learning state standards at their grade level:

- 4** = Exceeded Standard
3 = Met Standards
2 = Nearly Met Standards
1 = Not Met Standards
X = Not Assessed during that trimester

Academic Grades or A, B, C, D, F

A-F grades reflect a student's overall academic achievement and progress on daily classwork, classroom assessments, and homework. Depending on the grade level, academic grades may be given in English Language Arts, Mathematics, Science/Health and Social Studies. The student's academic grade may also reflect missing assignments or low test scores. These grades are used to determine grade point average, eligibility, and honor roll. Grades for Art, Music, and PE will be left blank during distance learning.

Lexile Test

A student receives a lexile reading score from taking a standardized reading test. This score measures the student's reading ability and matches the student to appropriate level books and other reading materials.
